LAW STUDENT'S INDIAN SUMMER

UNIVERSITY of Queensland law student Zac Frazer has been awarded a prestigious scholarship to study in India.

Mr Frazer, 23, will spend a semester at the Jindal Global University in Sonapat, north of New Delhi, after winning a prized New Colombo Plan scholarship, funded by the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade.

The scholarship, awarded annually since 2014, is worth up to \$69,000 and is aimed at deepening Australia's relationships in the Indo-Pacific region. Mr Frazer will complete

four university law subjects in India, including international law.

"I'm ready for the challenge, excited for it," he said. "India's such an important trading partner for Australia, it's so important for Australia's future, but there's a bit of a void there in terms of young lawyers being versed on India. It's an untapped resource."

Mr Frazer, who grew up in Yamba before moving to Brisbane to do an arts/law degree, is still contemplating his career direction, but he's determined to make a difference.

"Law is a great platform where you can see change," he said.
